What is the Youth Summit?

On April 22nd 2017 VIA hosted the first ever student-led youth summit in APS history!

Our youth summit consisted of 5 different trainings or workshops based on the areas that our membership chose. Then, our core VIA members became experts in those subjects by teaming up with our adult allies. The adult allies acted as mentors and educated us on the material that the students wanted to facilitate. The student facilitators then came up with the agenda and program for each workshop as well as for the whole summit. The workshops we held were;

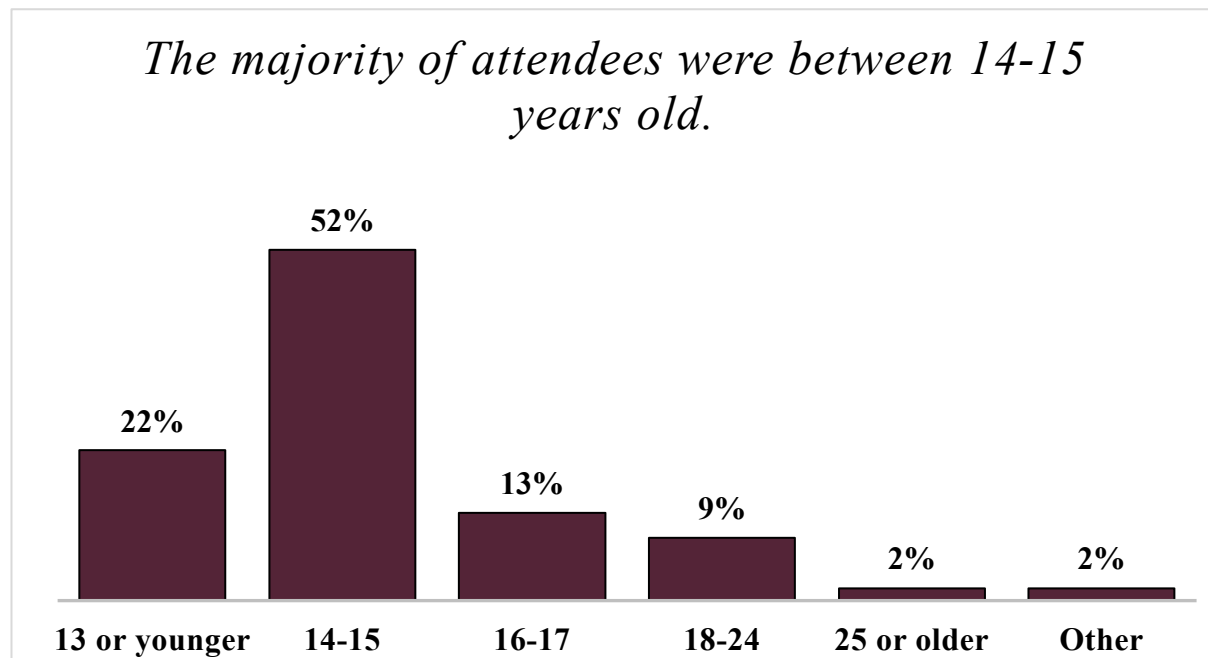
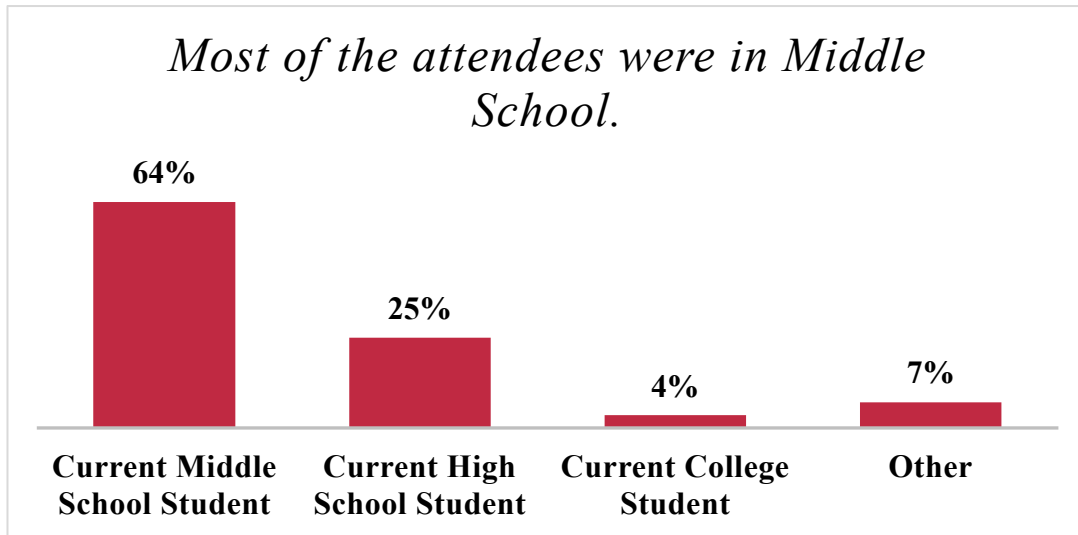
The following table are the future campaigns students want VIA to works on.

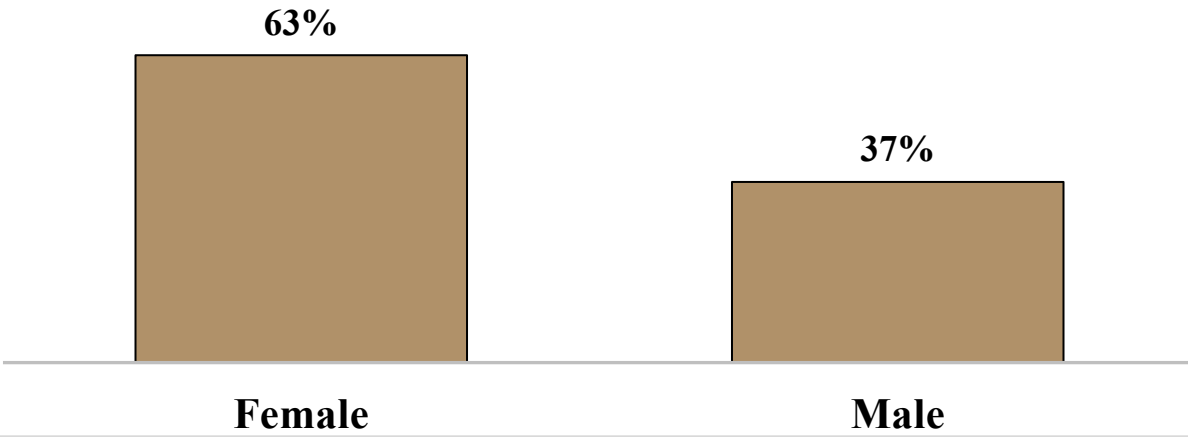

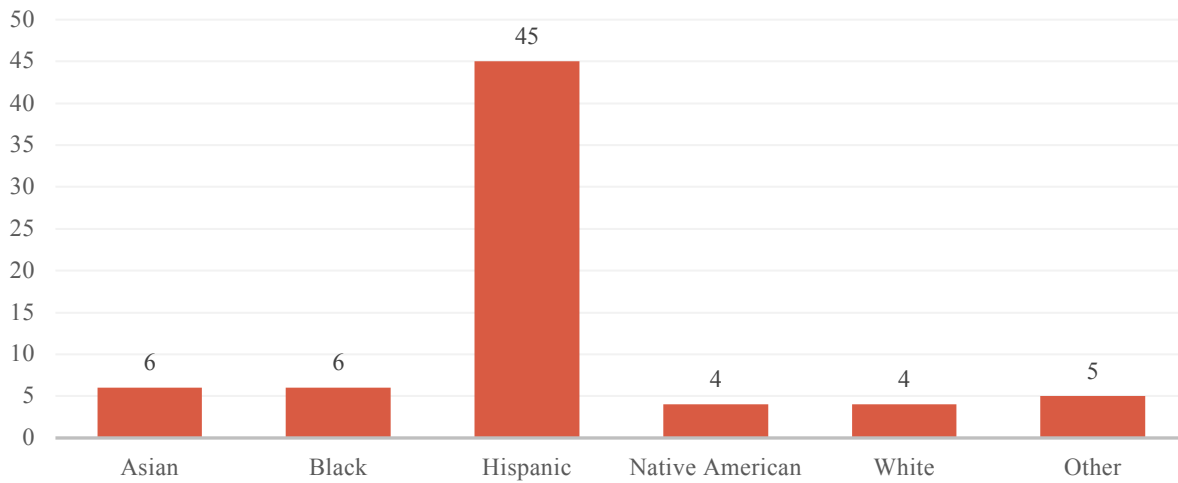
Youth Summit Evaluation Findings



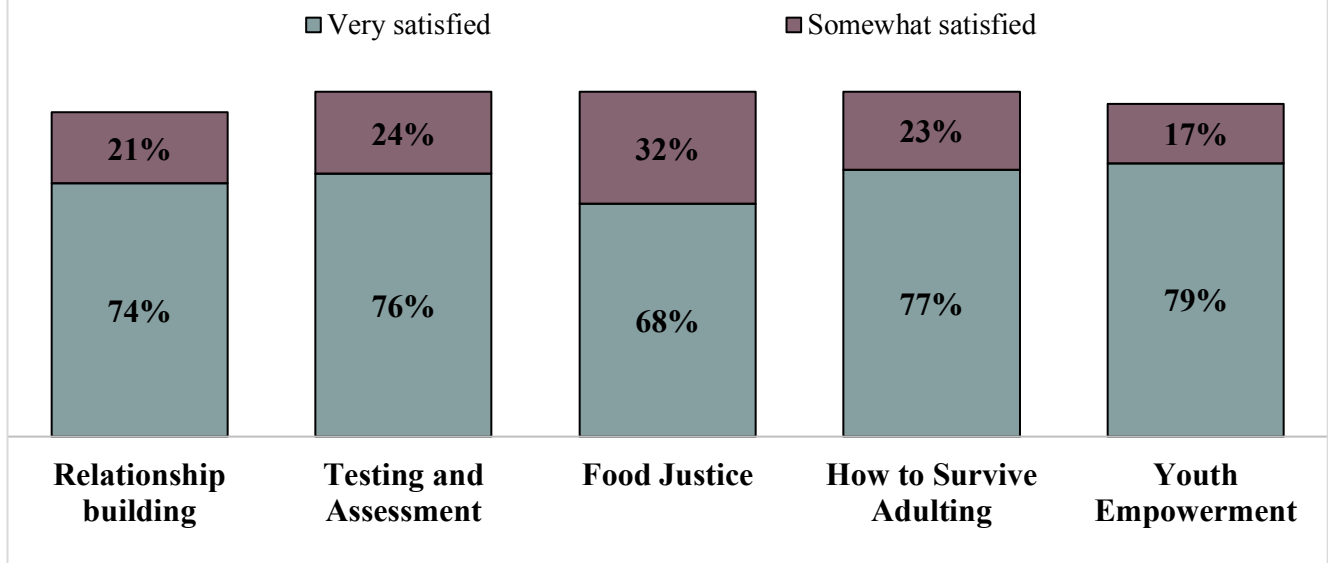
Most of the attendees were female.



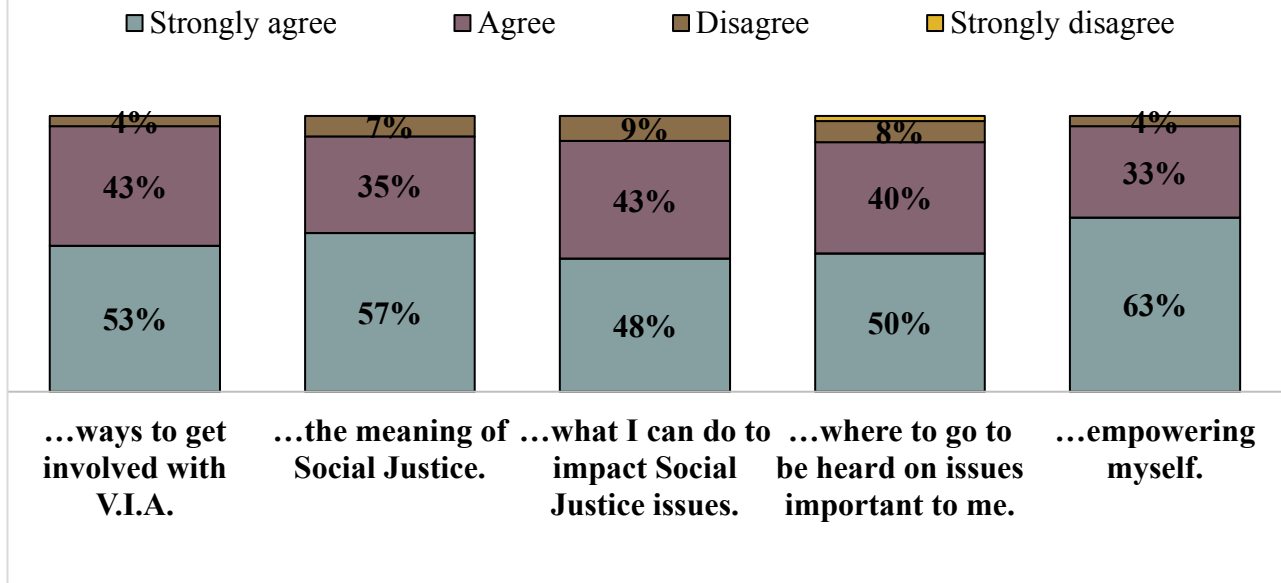
The majority of attendees were Hispanic.

Starting in August 2017, VIA will be hosting an after school program for Manzano High School and Washington Middle School! The afterschool program will meet once a week and will focus on different areas such as homework help, community campaigns, and workshops based on the needs and wants of the students involved. This is an amazing opportunity for students everywhere to develop their leadership skills, public speaking and other skills.
